





American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) FY 22-23 4th Quarter Report



ARPA Overview



- 1. March 11, 2021: \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus bill passed by 117th Congress signed into law by President Joe Biden.
- Federal funds were dispersed to State, territorial, local, and Tribal governments to respond to the economic and public health impacts of Covid-19.
- 3. City of Carson award= \$17.8 million
- 4. March 15,2022: Council Approved Item No. 35 The Use of ARPA Funds and adoption of Resolution 22-039
- 5. Funds must be obligated by **December 31,2024**, and fully expended by **December 31,2026**. Per U.S. Dept. of Treasury

\$3.3 Million Citywide Slurry Seal PW 1763

> September 6, 2022

Council Approved Item No. 36 award contract to Petrochem Materials Innovation, LLC in the amount of \$2.7 million

> October 6, 2022

Contract with PMI was fully executed, and Purchase Order issued in the amount of \$1.3 million.

> January 2023

Completion of work delayed due to current weather conditions.

> April 2023

Weather permitting, construction of the remaining 40% of the project will take place from May 1,2023 until June 30,2024.







- >On 7/19/22 Council approved a project management contract with **Integrated Technology Partners** to help the City manage the upgrade of Tyler Munis, Inventory, Tyler Payment Systems, and for the new integration of Enterprise Permitting and Licensing (EP&L).
- ➤ Migrate Tyler Munis from on premises to the "Cloud" for improved staff access, stronger security, and increased Disaster Recovery capabilities (Completed February 2023)
- ➤ Upgrade will include Human Resources Management, Payroll, Procurement/Contract, Budgeting, General Ledger, AP/AR, Financial Reporting (Completed February 2023)
- ➤ Upgrade to Tyler Munis ver. 2021.5 (Completed February 2023)
- Existing inventory data from IFAS and Excel pulled into Tyler Munis (Completed April 2023)
- Enterprise Permitting and Licensing (March 2023 July 2024) IN PROCESS

 Effort to streamline City Licensing (business and other), Permitting (planning, engineering, fire, etc.) and Code Enforcement



\$1.5 million Small Business Grants



> June 21, 2022

The City Council approved Item No. 35 Small Business Grant Program and Resolution 22-134.

- Small Business employee 1 to 50 employees.
- Size of Grants range from \$5,000 to \$25,000.
- The City has received 127 small business application received, with 46 applications approved.
- \$875,000 in small business grants issued as of end of FY 2022-2023 4th Quarter.

\$758,000 Non-Capital Items for Community Services



- ➤ During Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget workshops, Council requested staff with a list of non-capitalized equipment needs for parks and programs.
- > \$90,456 in ARPA Funds were expensed as of end of FY 2022-2023 4th Quarter.
- ➤ Staff plans to procure \$250,000 in office furniture and \$101,000 for 90KW Generator w/trailer in first quarter of Fiscal Year 2023-2024

- ➤ On May 2, 2023, the City Council awarded a Contract to Magellan Advisors, LLC to conduct a Citywide Broadband Assessment Study.
- A purchase order was issued on July 13, 2023, and subsequently, a kick-off meeting took place on July 17, 2023.
- ➤ The study's estimated timeline spans approximately 8 months, from the present to February 2024.
- > Stay updated on the plan's progress and results through a dedicated webpage on the City's website.
- ➤ Look out for project information in the Fall edition of the Carson Report, which includes a survey link. The survey incorporates a speed test to gather valuable feedback on in-home connectivity speeds. The survey will remain open through mid October 2023.



\$350,000 Wi-Fi at the Parks



> <u>September 20, 2022</u>

The City Council approved Wi-Fi implementation contract with **Datagear**.

- > Total Cost of the project is \$420,272:
 - \$350,000 from ARPA and
 - \$70,272 from the General Fund (only 16% of total cost).
 Estimated completion: Sept Dec. 2023
- Scope of Work:
 - Provide complete installation and configuration of an outside public WiFi network at 12 City Parks, City Hall, and Community Center.
 - After installation, provide support and maintain infrastructure for 5 years.
- Parks Completed so far: Mills Park, Carson Park

- Emergency Services (ES) staff have identified the necessary state of the art technology and functionality to bring the current Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to national incident management standards.
- ➤ Update: The architect has produced a proposed conceptual layout for the basement. Staff is now working with the architect to finalize the electrical and mechanical plans needed for the Construction Bid Package. Meanwhile, staff continues to finalize the furniture plan and interior design of the space. The past month has consisted of various demos/meetings with audio-visual vendors to compare costs and capabilities.
- ➤ Project will provide upgrades for the following departments:
 - > Emergency Services
 - Public Safety
 - > Information Technology




ARPA Spending on National Level



- Government Ops (Wages, Equip, Inv.) = \$15.4 billion
- Econ. & Workplace Dev(Small Bus. Support, Econ. Support, Tourism) = \$3.3 Billion
- Community Aid (Food Assistance, Non-Profit, Youth and Family Support) = \$4.1 Billion
- Infrastructure (Sewer, Broadband, Roadway) = \$4.4 Billion
- Housing (Homelessness, Rental Assistance) = \$4.2 Billion
- Public Health(Covid Response, Mental Health) = \$4.4 Billion
- Public Safety (Police, Violence Reduction, Fire) = \$3.2 Billion
