Cal Cities also protected <u>local transportation projects</u>, <u>safeguarded funding streams</u> used for critical services, and fought back against regulations that would have added <u>unnecessary bureaucracy</u>. In the courts, Cal Cities defended cities on a wide range of issues, notably their ability to <u>interpret their land use plans</u>.
