1. Project No. 675 – Sepulveda Bridge Widening from Alameda to East City Limit

Location: Sepulveda Blvd. from Alameda to East City Limit

Description: The project involves the widening and improvement of the roadway and bridge along Sepulveda Boulevard to provide three lanes of traffic in both directions, construction of new sidewalk, relocation of existing electrical poles, and the modification of the existing traffic signal.

Budget: \$7,091,999.00

Status:

- Design is 99%-complete and is awaiting approvals from LA County, USACE, LARWQB. SCE needs to finalize the design of their relocations and provide a schedule to the City for the relocations. - Staff received an updated cost estimate of \$12M from the Consultant, the cost increase is due to inflation from 2016, changes in the structural section to avoid conflict with existing utility lines, and to meet the current design code.
- Staff <u>submitted will be submitting</u> request for additional \$5M funding to Metro, expecting to hear back from Metro in first quarter of 2022.

Annual Concrete Replacement Program

Location: Victoria Street from Figueroa St. to Avalon Blvd. and various streets on adjacent zones.

Description: The project includes concrete reconstruction, tree removal and replacement, asphalt concrete pavement overlay, repair of damaged sidewalks, driveway approaches, curbs and gutters, and access ramps. It will also include the improvements requested by the City Council in the following locations: 186th Street, Caspian St., Main St/220th Street.

Budget: \$1,656,431.25

- Contractor still has to take care of some punch list items and need to perform testing on the system.
- Parks and Rec staff <u>started occupying will be able to occupy ththe</u> park facilities oin <u>December 16, 2021 January 2022</u>, with the exception of the ball field area.

REGIONAL AND STATE PROJECTS:

1. SR 91

• Caltrans is currently in the beginning of the design phase of expanding the 91 to accommodate for increased truck traffic

Staff attended Caltrans' first design overview with Compton

- Environmental, Aesthetic and Noise comments were provided
- Assemblyman Gibson has requested the comments provided to Caltrans to be sent to his office
- A follow-up meeting with be held with Caltrans and their design consultant in <u>January</u>

SR 47

In February, 2021, staff (Asst. City Manager, Dir of PW, and AWA lawyer) met with Caltrans' local lawyers to discuss Caltrans taking over SR 47, as originally discussed in the State legislature in the early 1980s. At that time, Caltrans

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- indicated that if Carson wanted the State to take over the road, Carson would have to "bring it up to Caltrans design requirements" prior to them taking it back
- In August, during the beginning of the Ports of LA and Long Beach Supply Chain crisis, the White House liaison reached out to Carson's City Manager, Director of PW and AWA's transportation lawyer, to discuss possibilities of Carson playing a role in the supply chain solution. Caltrans taking over SR 47 was presented by Carson. After Carson discussed why Carson believed the State should take it over, the liaison indicated he would see what could be done and agreed to the logic of Carson's proposal re: SR 47.
- Caltrans announced in a meeting with Carson and the White House Liaison, that
 they agreed that SR 47 was a route that the State of California should own and
 maintain.
- Staff has had a few follow up discussions and will be meeting in early January to layout a draft MOU. There will be a MOU while Caltrans obtains approval from the California Transportation Commission to take back SR 47.
- When complete, the MOU will be presented to the City Council for approval and this is anticipated for the January 18 City Council Meeting.

3. Dominguez Channel

- Discussions with LA County continue re: both near term and long term solutions
- LA County has agreed to present the work that they have done over the years related to Dominguez Channel to update the City on completed efforts

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
