The Community Services/ Recreation/ Park Maintenance Department comprises three divisions: Administration, Community Services, and Recreation. The Department delivers services and programs to support citizens' diverse interests in parks, recreation, and culture. This includes operating and maintaining twelve (12) parks, four (4) mini-parks, two (2) aquatic centers, two (2) pools, a sports complex, and a boxing center. The Carson Event Center offers 40,000 square feet of versatile meeting and event space, including 12,000 square foot ballroom and meeting rooms that accommodate between 5 and 1,200 guests. It also offers state-of-the-art visual services. Transportation provides citywide transportation programs related to fixed-route public transit, specialized elderly and disabled transit, transit support of city park programs, and regional air quality issues.

RECREATION DIVISION

For July, the Reservations section had a total of 127 reservations scheduled, with 35 indoor (activity/recreation room) and 92 outdoor (picnic grass/shelter) reservations. We had over 300 calls and inquiries for park fees and availability. The City of Carson organized several events in July, including a Neighborhood Food Drive, a 55th Anniversary Street Fair special event, and awards banquets for various parks' youth sports programs.

STROKE CENTER

The Stroke Center operates Monday through Thursday, 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., is staffed by Nathan Caukin, and is fully supported by Daniel Murillo, Tony Zuniga, and Sue Quedado. One (1) new member was registered this month and has become fully immersed in the programming, three (3) visitors were permitted on-site (for observation purposes only), and a new survivor was added to the OT rotation. For the month of July, Dr. Penoliar provided occupational therapy on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. (except on 07/27/23), allowing for five (5) sessions per day for a total of 40 potential therapy sessions for the month. He also added an extra day, Monday, July 3, 2023, to provide additional care. OT is available by appointment only.

Equipment Exercise appointments are available Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. in the Stroke Center. Chair Exercise classes facilitated by Sue Quedado at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays continue to grow. The chair volleyball program, held Wednesdays at 11:30 a.m., continues to flourish, and its popularity grows weekly. Staff are diligently working on safety precautions, and the group continues to practice in anticipation of an intra-departmental volleyball challenge. Phone inquiries about new memberships, membership requirements, programming, and services available to survivors have been very high this month, including those from outside sources (LB Stroke Support Association, CSULB PT pro bono, Ranchos Los Amigos).

SENIOR RECREATION

Senior Recreation continues administering Virtual Zoom fitness classes run by one designated staff member. This class is held on Thursdays from 9:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m., with a fluctuation of attendance ranging from 9 to 16 students per class. Senior Recreation continues to offer free in-person classes at

Carson Park and Stevenson Park inside the gymnasium. Classes include Zumba, Yoga, Hula Hoop, Functional Fitness, Zumba Gold, Line Dancing, Open Basketball, and an open fitness room with workout equipment. All classes are held Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. - 11:45 a.m., with a fluctuation of attendance ranging from 7 to 65 participants per class. Two on-site staff members are always available to check in participants, rotate rounds of checking in on each program, and perform a walkthrough of each class and fitness room to ensure the facility is thoroughly swept, cleaned and machines are wiped down.

Foisia Park provides a drop-in open fitness room with workout equipment, open basketball, and chess for senior participants. The program is run Monday - Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. with two staff members available to check participants in, rotate rounds of checking in on each program, performing a walkthrough of each class and fitness room to ensure the facility is thoroughly swept, clean, and machines are wiped down. Carson Event Center continues to provide drop-in Needle Craft offered Tuesdays and Fridays from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., Salsa Dance class Tuesdays from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., Table games Thursdays from 10:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Senior Social Bingo Club on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. in the Dominguez Room at the Carson Event Center. In addition, Bingo for Fun with the Swinging 50's Club is offered at Dominguez Park on Wednesdays from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. with three (3) upcoming classes starting in August, including Tai Chi, Chair Exercise, and Yoga. All programs are free for adults 50 years and older.

SENIOR SOCIAL SERVICES

Senior Social Service's mission is to ensure our most vulnerable homebound seniors stay home safely while meeting their essential needs. Senior Service Aide visits are running with full caseloads on a weekly and bi-weekly basis. Assistance consists of running errands, including trips to the grocery store and pharmacy, and assisting with essential chores that keep our seniors home safe while maintaining their independence. Due to increased referrals, staff has added more seniors to this and other city programs and referred seniors to County and State programs.

It is with great excitement that the staff welcomes Ilene Renteria as the new Human Services Assistant Coordinator. With a decade of part-time work in the senior services field, she has amassed a wealth of experience working with seniors. Currently, she is eagerly learning the ropes of her newly assumed position.

The Assisted Living program staff helps other departments, including Code Enforcement, Housing, and Transportation. Senior Services Aides help seniors without transportation complete Dial-A-Ride (DAR) applications, Code Enforcement Hoarding cases, general welfare checks, adult protective service cases, and LA Homeless Portal cases as needed. Housing Rights Center walk-in clinics have resumed and occur monthly. Human Services is working closely with LAHSA's Homeless/Housing Coordinator as affordable senior housing remains a huge issue. Staff continue to receive inquiries about housing daily and refers them as necessary.

Keeping abreast of the latest county, state, and federal programs, organizations, and community partners that offer virtual programming is essential to ensuring our seniors have access to the latest programs. Furthermore, the staff is working closely with Bet Tzedek Legal, CSUDH OLLI, and others to schedule classes and workshops for 2023. The county's Adult Protective Services and Carson Sheriff's Station continue to collaborate on welfare checks.

This year, support groups have been ongoing with Senior Share Storytellers, Bereavement, Caregiver Support, and the Kinship Support group. In addition, several upcoming workshops will take place, including a collaboration with the SBCCOG on Senior Eco-friendly edible gardening; the previous gardening workshop had 90 attendees! Staff plans to make this a monthly series. Other upcoming events include a blood drive with the American Red Cross and our quarterly Senior Information and Resource Fair.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

Early Childhood continues to offer full–time classes Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Carson Event Center and Carson Park. Part-time classes are offered Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. or 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Event Center and Dolphin Park. The approximate revenue for the month of July was \$31,345.

Families with children under 18 in the home can receive prevention and aftercare services through case navigation, resources, and referrals. These families are referred by the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) or other organizations; in some cases, they are self-referred. Case navigation involves one-on-one communication between the case navigator and the family to discuss struggles, accomplishments, and goals. Families who do not need case navigation can also be provided with additional links. The links may include but are not limited to food giveaways, counseling services, tutoring services, or housing services. As a result, most case navigation is now conducted in person, depending on the client's and staff's comfort level. Social connection, Youth and Family groups, Crafty Club, and Ladies Circle are ongoing. The Nurturing Father program and the Girls Empowerment Group have started and are very successful.

TRANSPORTATION

The City of Carson's Transportation workgroup provides citywide transportation programs, including fixed-route public bus service, first mile/last mile ride-hail services, specialized elderly and disabled transportation services, and bus transportation in support of City parks and youth programs. Transportation also works directly with LA Metro, South Bay Cities Council of Government (SBCCOG), and South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) on a variety of transportation policies, new initiatives, and funding opportunities.

LONG BEACH TRANSIT

Long Beach Transit (LBT) provides fixed-route bus services in Carson across three routes. Riders can travel down major surface streets in both directions and connect faster to major destinations and neighboring bus lines. CARSON CIRCUIT

In conjunction with LBT, the Carson Circuit provides additional bus service through two neighborhood-serving routes.

To better meet the needs of its riders, service runs during peak commuting times between 7:00 am - 9:55 am and again from 2:00 pm - 4:55 pm. These modifications were also supported by the City's recently completed Comprehensive Operations Analysis or route study. The current promotion of the service includes advertisements on the City's social media pages, distribution of flyers, and other methods.

Ridership is expected to increase as more riders learn about the program and its routes. Additional flyers and social media posts will help promote awareness across the community.

DIAL-A-RIDE

Through the end of the declared pandemic, Dial-A-Ride service has been made available to Carson residents of all ages, with or without disabilities. Participants can order on-demand taxi service and receive a 50% discount on their ride. Carson residents can take advantage of complimentary no-cost taxi rides to and from any City-designated vaccination site within three (3) miles of City boundaries. Taxi drivers will stay with the riders throughout the entire process, ensuring a safe and worry-free return.

LYFT

Carson residents can receive a 50% discount on the cost of their Lyft ride. Riders pay half, and the city pays half, up to a maximum trip cost of \$20. Participants must be 18 years of age or older to ride alone. Rides must start AND end within City boundaries.

The majority of rides took 7-8 minutes in duration, 2-3 miles in distance. Average trip costs are rising due to:

(1) Increased ride times from traffic returning to pre-pandemic levels and (2) Nationwide shortage of drivers/gig workers.

FUTURE PLANS

To enhance LBT and Carson Circuit service, staff recently concluded a capital improvement project to upgrade the City's bus stops with new shelters, benches, and trash receptacles. The upgrades match the newer silver units along Carson Street and near CSUDH.

Additionally, staff is awaiting the delivery of two battery-electric buses (BEB) as a pilot. EV buses emit zero greenhouse gasses, providing a cleaner environment for riders and residents. Upfront purchase costs exceed traditional internal combustion engine (ICE) examples. However, annual operating costs for EVs are expected to be significantly less than their ICE counterparts.
