The City of Carson is honored to participate as a venue city in connection with Los Angeles' candidature for the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Dear Mr. President:

This letter is in connection with the Candidature File for the City of Los Angeles, in response to Section 2.4 of the Candidature Questionnaire Olympic Games 2024 (G2.2, 2.3, 2.11, 2.13, 2.22, 2.25, 2.31 and 2.32). The City of Carson (the "Venue City") is honored to participate as a venue city in connection with Los Angeles' candidature for the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games (the "Games").

I offer my enthusiastic support on behalf of the City of Carson for Los Angeles' candidature to host the Games, and am thrilled that Los Angeles is working with the City of Carson to host Games events at venues in Carson.

The diversity of our region and people makes Los Angeles, and surrounding venue cities such as Carson, a spectacular location to host the world, and Carson stands ready to partner with the City of Los Angeles in this endeavor.

It is our understanding that the Stub Hub Center in Carson is planned for four Olympic Events (rugby, tennis, BMX and track cycling) and two events for the Paralympics (tennis and track cycling). Stub Hub is operated by AEG Worldwide, who owns and operates the venue. Venue related costs to the City are reimbursed under a separate Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Carson. The City of Carson is not planning on constructing any buildings or infrastructure, or renovations to exiting facilities to support the Games, as these are the

responsibility of AEG. Notwithstanding any provisions of this letter, the confirmations and guarantees in this letter (where applicable) are of course all subject to the appropriate reimbursement agreements successfully being negotiated and put in place with AEG and/or any other applicable agencies.

I hereby confirm, on behalf of the City of Carson, as follows:

With respect to Guarantee 2.2 of the IOC Questionnaire:

The Venue City hereby confirms and undertakes, to the maximum extent of its authority, that no major public or private event, conference, or other meeting which could have an impact on the successful planning, organizing, financing and staging of the Games or their public and media exposure, will take place within the Venue City itself, or its neighborhoods, during the Games or during the preceding or following week, without the prior written approval of the IOC.

With respect to Guarantee 2.3 of the IOC Questionnaire:

- The United States Olympic Committee and City of Los Angeles, in letters provided in support of Guarantee 2.3, have comprehensively described the existing federal, state, and Host City legislation in place to protect the integrity of the Games experience for all Olympic stakeholders, including laws that will protect the IOC's rights and interests in relation to the Games.
- The Venue City confirms that appropriate legislation is in place in the Venue City to control unauthorized street trading within the vicinity of Games venues. Specifically, Municipal Code 4118.3 and 4118.4 prohibit utilizing public property in the Venue City for any display of merchandise for sale and from selling any goods at any stadium, athletic field or community center within the Venue City without prior consent; Municipal Code 9138.8 prohibits sales in connection with temporary sidewalk, parking lot, and tent sales, and special events except with written owner and city approval; and Municipal Code 63143 and 63150 require peddlers and street vendors respectively obtain a city permit to operate.
- To the extent additional efforts or measures are required within its jurisdiction, the Venue City shall work with the Organizing Committee for the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games to ensure protection of the IOC's rights and interests in relation to the Games.

With respect to Guarantee 2.11 of the IOC Questionnaire:

1. The Venue City guarantees that with the cooperation and participation of AEG, it shall provide within the territorial limit of the Venue City the normal level and range of public services customarily provided by the Venue City to support the successful planning, organization and staging of the portions of 2024 Games within its territorial limits.

With respect to Guarantee 2.13 of the IOC Questionnaire:

The Venue City agrees that in cooperation with the City of Los Angeles, the Los Angeles 2024 Exploratory Committee, the OCOG and local, regional and national business, trade and service organizations, it will promote and encourage, to the extent permitted by law, the charging of ordinary and customary prices for goods and services associated with the 2024 Games within its territorial limits (including, but not limited to, hotel rates,

restaurants and related services) for anyone attending the 2024 Games, including non-accredited spectators. Under California Business and Professions Code Section 17200, the Venue City has broad authority to protect spectators and participants from unfair business practices during the Games.

With respect to Guarantee 2.22 of the IOC Questionnaire:

The Venue City guarantees, to the maximum extent of its authority, that the accessibility standards to be applied for the Paralympic Games shall include the United States' Americans with Disabilities Act and Fair Housing Act and California's Fair Employment and Housing Act, Unruh Civil Rights Act, Disabled Persons Act, and Ralph Civil Rights Act. The Venue City will cooperate with the OCOG to ensure that accessibility will be fully integrated into the planning of the Paralympic Games taking place within its territorial limits. (The United States has also signed the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, but the U.S. Congress has not yet consented to ratification.)

With respect to Guarantee 2.25 of the IOC Questionnaire:

The Venue City guarantees, to the maximum extent of its authority, that, in addition to applicable federal and state laws, all venue construction and infrastructure development projects necessary for the organization of the 2024 Games within its territorial limits will comply with local planning, construction, protection of the environment, health and safety, labor, and anti-corruption laws. These include:

- The Building Regulations Article of the Municipal Code Building Chapter (Article 8, Chapter 1) (containing building codes);
- The Planning and Zoning Article of the Municipal Code Zoning Chapter (Article 9, Chapter 1) (containing planning laws);
- The Environmental Commission Section of the of the Municipal Code Departments, Boards and Commissions Chapter, Administration Article (Article 2, Chapter 7, Section 2750) (containing environmental regulations);
- The Discrimination and Harassment Prevention Chapter of the Municipal Code Administration Article (Article 2, Chapter 11) (containing anti-discrimination protections); and
- The Code of Ethics Section of the Municipal Code City Offices Chapter, Administration Article (Article 2, Chapter 4, Section 2450) (containing anticorruption protections).

With respect to Guarantee 2.31 of the IOC Questionnaire:

The Venue City agrees that the operations of the Venue City's transport and traffic command and control operations will be made available to support and will be integrated within the overall Games transport and traffic solution.

With respect to Guarantee 2.32 of the IOC Questionnaire:

Consistent with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's commitment to designate the 2024 Games a National Special Security Event, the Venue City guarantees and agrees to work with the International Olympic Committee, the U.S. Department of Homeland

Security, OCOG and AEG Worldwide to ensure a safe and peaceful celebration of the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The City of Carson looks forward to continuing to work with the City of Los Angeles towards our shared objective of Los Angeles being selected to host the Games. Bringing the Games back to Southern California is a great opportunity for us to showcase our diverse and vibrant region to the world, and we stand ready to partner with the City of Los Angeles in this endeavor.
