Greetings,

I fully support the timely renaming of my second home as I was growing up in Carson to "James Foisia Park." I grew up across the street from the park and more often than not, mom would seek me out for dinner as the sun was setting. The recreation leaders were family to me and so many others.

James was my classmate at Carson High School. His leadership and academic achievements were not well known at the time, but he helped put the future City of Carson on the Map. As a member of the Carson Colt L.A. City Football Team in 1966, he was an inspiration and in the following year, All-League and All-City.

James was one of only a few to receive a 4-year scholarship upon graduation in 1968 - football at UCLA. I squeaked out a nomination to the Air Force Academy. Years later at a visit home to Carson I wandered over to my second home, the park. James was in the office. I asked for a basketball. He said the gym is closed. After a hug despite my now aching ribs, he gave a ball and opened the gym door. Good thing no one else was watching

My 10-years younger brothers played sports at the park. James looked after them as if they were family. One day my kid brother lost his wallet at the park with only his name in it. James walked it home and gave it to our mother. Renaming a well-known name of a long-named rec facility in Carson will not be easy, but Do It!

Honorable Chairperson and Commissioners,

For the record, the Foisia family are not the architects of this renaming project, nor is the family the driving force behind this matter. Rather, as a tribute to James' memory, the Foisia family supports and stands behind those who knew James' contribution to this city and thus believe he is worthy of this park renaming.

While some may argue to the contrary and cite the gymnasium that is named in his honor as sufficient recognition, this is akin to a token pat on the back. Whereas, the renaming of Scott Park not only will it encompass the gymnasium but it is a true distinction reflective of an individual who, according to testaments heard at the October 16, 2018 Council meeting, and again at last night's community meeting, November 13, 2018, has left a lasting positive impact and influence to the hundreds of young lives who frequented Scott Park, also to the staff who worked under his leadership throughout the years of his tenure at Scott Park.

Others may say General Winfield Scott has more *star power* being a highly decorated Army General in the 1800s. Although this is an undeniable historical fact, this park was named by Los Angeles County before our city was incorporated. However, our city has named four parks in honor of outstanding Carson city leaders and residents.

It must be noted that the City of Carson prides itself on its diversity, whereby African Americans, Anglo Americans, Asians, Mexican Americans, Pacific Islanders, live side by side and respect each other's unique culture and have annual celebrations of their heritage that is supported and encouraged by our city leaders. To promote this exceptional image, our landmarks, such as parks, should radiate and enhance this concept.

A personal observation revealed how relatively simple and uncluttered the process was to name parks in the good old days! Unfortunately staff is working under the guidelines of SMP 1.8a, which upon inspection is outdated and ambiguous. I trust this commission will do its due diligence and make a favorable recommendation to the city council.




